

Johnson County DEMOGRAPHICS



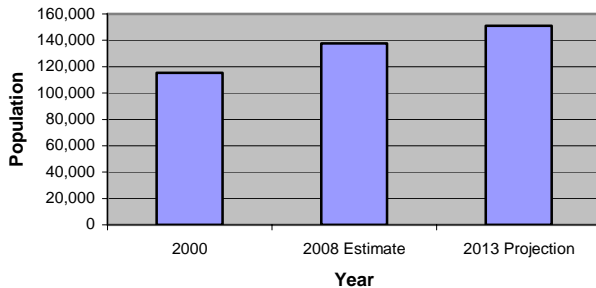
